As well as several star attractions on at the Cossack itself, the Wilde Club at the Leadmill is hosting the carnival party, which will include stilt walkers, clowns, magicians, candy floss and all the fun of the fair, as well as DJ Jools' disco delights. **30,000 pack PRIDE Village**

Despite threats of a downpour, Pride 90 pulled in over 20,000 on the march, with over 30,000 visitors to the Pride village, which contained over 200 stalls and tents. 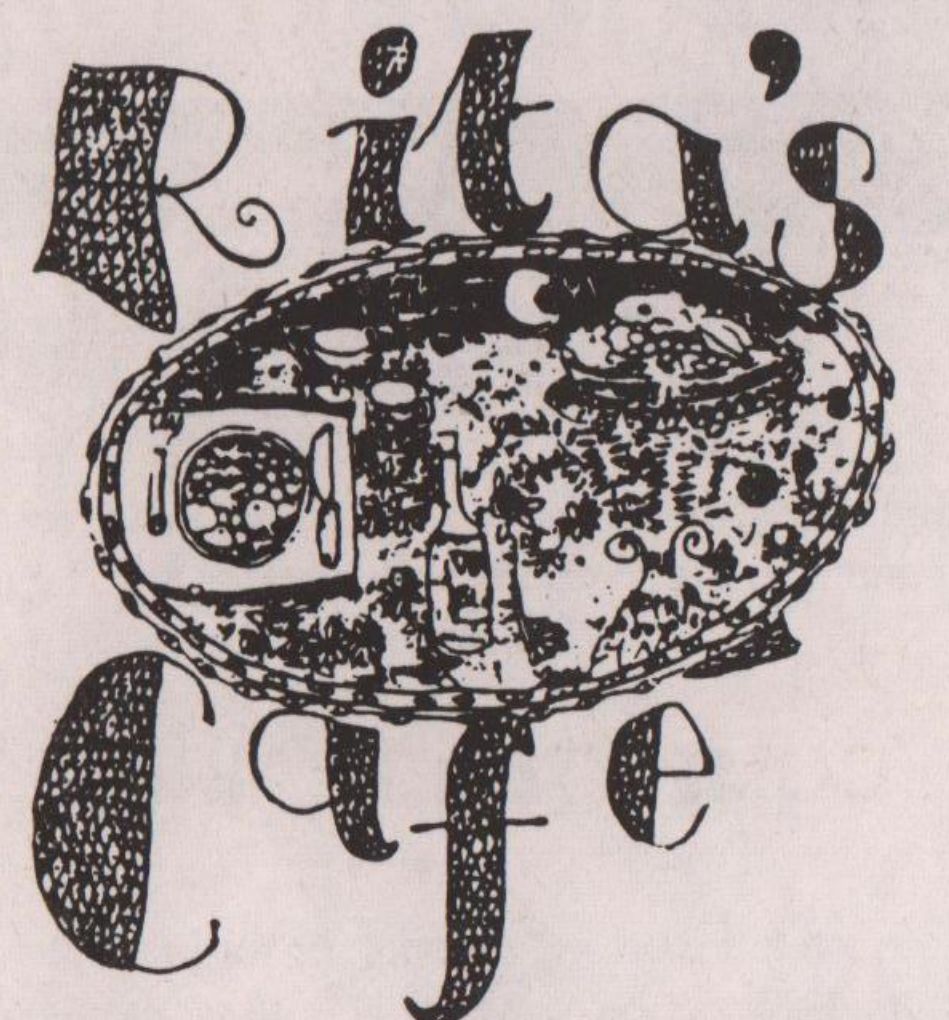

the Bang Disco Tent and the Womens' Tent, both forever heaving with dancers. Many others chose to watch the concert on the open stage, which featured Belgian singer Mathilde Santing, magician Fay Presto and black poet/singer Storme Webber. To get behind the headlines, we include here one personal view of Pride:

"Martin, it's chucking it down with rain outside." The voice from the next seat echoed in my aching head.

I was slumped down, feet in the air, on a coach which was wading through the pouring rain. I rubbed and opened my eyes to see a handsome young Asian boy running his fingers through my hair. It was my true love (who for family reasons doesn't want to be named) and he was letting me know that PRIDE 1990, our first, might just be besieged by rain this year.

The rest of the coach was very lively, singing along to the radio cassette player. Such greats as the theme from the camp American TV sitcom 'Laverne and Sherlie' was a favourite, as well as the tune from the timeless cartoon classic, 'Stop the Pigeon'.

The Nottingham coaches to PRIDE were very well organised. Our Coach Queen spent the journey chatting, selling drinks and food, and giving lots of advice on what to see at the now legendary lesbian and gay event, helping to make the atmosphere very lively and friendly. I just wished I hadn't gone to that party the night before.

Fortunately, when we arrived in London, the rain had stopped, the sun was out and my hangover was no more. So the two of us stood around in the sunshine waiting for the demo to start. Then, to our surprise, Peter Tatchell (out, gay Labour Party person) approached us and asked if we wanted to go to the front of the march.


"What for?" I asked the great one. "To get a cross section of lesbians and gay men," he said, and pointed to the side of the demo.

We made our way to the front of the noisy, humoured and beautiful crowd, where the chatty Michael Cashman (of EastEnders, Bent and all that) was posing for the press. The cameras took what seemed a thousand pictures and later, the march moved off.

And what a march. Someone in drag appeared along the way dressed as Margaret Thatcher (you may have seen him at the poll tax demo). The masses booed and shouted the usual 'Maggie Out' slogans, which at PRIDE mean something slightly different.

This wasn't just another demo. It was something special. You really have to be there to feel the energy and the emotion that's about. Taking my boyfriend in my arms, for a while we forgot that we live in a racist and homophobic society, that usually keeps the two of us apart.

The march over, we legged it to Kennington Park, where a host of events were being held. A toilet and a bag of chips later, we surveyed the surroundings, wide-eyed. I cannot

begin to list what was going on that afternoon, there was so much. The highlight for me was seeing all the out-of-place, straight-looking people trying to sell left-wing papers, and on the whole failing, while the many normal, totally brilliant people dressed in drag or in leather, and bloody proud to be gay, looked totally at home.

The Police looked on. We had arrived in London at 12.45pm. We had seen thousands of people and met dozens of new friends. We saw bands, cabaret, got drunk and had the time of our lives. We left London at 1.00am; twelve-and-a-half hours of PRIDE just wasn't long enough.

**Our first PRIDE had been something else. A day we'll never forget.**



**Housing Co-op for Nottingham**  
A new housing co-operative, specifically to meet the housing needs of lesbians and gay men, has recently set up house in Nottingham. Called "Pride 28 Housing Project", its aim, according to founder-member Nik Walton, is to provide a welcoming and supportive setting free from hostile tenants or landlords, where lesbians and gay men can live with their dependants. Homelessness or poor housing affects all disadvantaged groups but, as yet, there are still too few projects for our communities. Once there is enough money, it is hoped to buy a property outright which will have disabled access and will be owned and run by the tenants themselves. **HEY BUDDY!**

The AIDS Liaison Unit of the Southern Derbyshire Health Authority is due to start a Buddy home support scheme.

A Buddy is a volunteer who makes a commitment to befriend, support and care for a person living with HIV or AIDS. The role will be determined by the person they work with as will be the level of support they offer. The needs of an individual can be wide ranging from companionship, practical help, someone to listen and talk to on a regular agreed basis, to talk to on the phone or visit at a difficult time, or just knowing that someone who cares is available.

Buddies aim to complement, rather than replace, existing support given by partners, friends, family and statutory agencies.

The scheme is being organised by Martin Fox who works in the AIDS Liaison Unit as the voluntary Co-ordinator.

"I am keen to hear from people who feel that they would like to do this type of voluntary work and could offer the commitment. Full training will be given and any personal expenses incurred would be paid for by us. Ongoing contact and support for the Buddy will be an essential part of the scheme," said Martin.

Alejandro Jodorowsky's SANTA SANGRE is two hours of arresting cinema, the like of which has not been seen since the films of the late Luis Buñuel.

Fenix, a young asylum inmate, is obsessed with his memories of childhood and of the Gringo Circus where he and his parents performed with a heady mix of freaks, sad-faced clowns and a tattooed lady. The son of Concha, a trapeze artist and religious maniac, Fenix looks on as his jealous mother catches his father in the arms of the tattooed lady and hurls acid over his genitals. Orgo the knife thrower seeks revenge and manages to sever his wife's arms before killing himself in despair. Years later, the grown up Fenix has given up the use of his own arms to his mother's use in a bizarre novelty act carried over to domestic life and beyond.

At the risk of relegation to the 'museum of surrealism', and in a spirit which suggests a consciousness insulated from 20 years of feminism, Jodorowsky delivers a strange, violent and extraordinary visual fantasy. Oddly the film is apparently based on the events of a true story...

With rumours of ill-health, and an increasing need to find foreign investment for his productions, many had thought that RAN would be Akira Kurosawa's last cinematic statement. But now five years on, and fresh from picking up an honorary Oscar, we have DREAMS, a compendium of eight vivid sequences drawn from various stages of his life.

The dreams include THE TUNNEL, a seamless take featuring a ghost regiment and Kurosawa's fears of the military, and CROWS, with Martin Scorsese as Vincent Van Gogh.

"The impetus for the film is really something quite simple. That is a passage in a novel by Dostoevsky where he talks about dreams and the fact that they express our deepest fears and greatest hopes, and that this expression takes a shape that is something quite marvellous and unexpected and unimaginable in daily life. So I wrote down on paper a dream from my childhood, and this developed into a collaboration of other vivid dreams from various stages of my life."
