



11 Years On And Still Going Strong

Meet John Tremblay from Atlanta, USA, visiting in Lincoln recently. He was diagnosed with HIV 11 years ago, and OUTRIGHT asked him why it was important for him to be open and positive about his HIV status.

"Post-diagnosis, I suffered survivor's guilt for nearly 2 years: Why should I be alive when so many of my friends had died? my life seemed to have been taken over by the diagnosis but following counselling and therapy I decided I had to take back

control of my life. With that control I began to feel much better about myself and felt I could be a good role model for others".

"I had decided would not take AZT because of the difficulty with the toxic side effects so when I was asked to take AZT because my T cell had count dropped, I left the trial study and began to look at other research data.'



Around that time eight years ago, the Alabama Pulmonary Association was investigating a drug therapy called PCM4 which used a herbal liquid extract of swine pituitary glands. I have been on their trial now for three years, plus vitamin therapy including selinium and have witnessed a slow but steady increase in my T cell count. Of the 30 people of the original study including myself not one of us has so far






Forget the cappuccino - Rouge is the astringent, concentrated expresso of gay magazines. The thinking queer's mag, if you like. No personal ads, no vodka, no snapshots of hot and heaving clubs. No fashion, no horoscopes, no gossip.

"So - what's in it for me?" I hear you mutter. Well, nearly 50

pages of good, solid, cover-to-cover reading. Split about 50/50 between interesting, thought provoking features and sharp, intelligent reviews.

This issue's features cover gender in a big way with a very informative article on gender-juggling and an in-depth profile of singer Wayne County.

There are equally brain-engaging pieces on AIDS and Art, Politics, the Age of Consent, Euthanasia and a wild and witty essay by the late David McDiarmid, one of Australia's leading gay artists, on his search for men, art, sex and the perfect hairstyle.



There's a brief glance at video too and a substantial 10 page book section. Reviewing everything from 'The SM Gay's 3rd Resource Book' to 'Found Wanting; Women, Christianity and Sexuality" with plenty of politics, biography and airport novels in between.

Not to everyone's taste - and if you're a dedicated club-bunny - you probably won't like it. But if you're tired of scanning those grey acres of small print classifieds or need a break from squinting at grainy club crowd photos, trying to spot someone you know - try it.


Due to an overwhelming demand, LesBe-Well, the national lesbian health project, is developing a national support network for people who have experienced violence in lesbian relationships.

Sometimes beautiful, sometimes a good songwriter, but always with a voice that makes your own sound like sandpaper - it's hard to dismiss the talents of k d lang.

What The South Bank Show did best was to present a slice of K.D. Irresistible - or merely interesting - but 100% Dyke with a touch of vulnerability on top. In terms of K.D's musical career, it charted her early days as whacky country singer through self-exploration to experiments with pop and present day quest for simplicity.

Owen Bradley, Ben Mink, Johnny Carson, they were all there to validate our Cathy's talent - Madonna never showed.

What was on offer was a look at respectable Canadian ly, Mrs. Lang, talking about "My little girl" and a geter-specs-on chance to gawp at some cinefilm, early video and photos of a young K.D.

Bad hairstyles and bad skirts were plentiful. There were, however, some omissions for the nosey lesbian viewer. K.D's dyke-life obviously being her major inspiration - what about that scintillating look at where she hangs out. What does she do when she's not making music with the lads?

Alas - the programme did not provide the gay population with the missing pictures. (What did we expect?). Perhaps that's why it was - as Oscar Wilde said of a cigarette (or 'Three Cigarettes') 0 a perfect pleasure - 0 because it left you just that little bit unsatisfied.

Wallace explained. "It's fighting for equality not just for ourselves but for everybody." Some years ago the LGLA scored a major coup in organising a boycott of Coors that led every gay bar in San Francisco to fuse to carry the beer, as a way of protesting at the Coors mily's anti-gay rhetoric and financial support of far-right political candidates.

The LGLA is also a regular participant in cultural events like the annual Pride Parade, where it had 100 supporters carrying banners with the LGLA motto, "An injury to one is an injury to all". Next June the LGLA will host its first National Pride at Work Conference and has already invited hundreds of national lesbian and gay trade unionists from across USA to San Francisco for the conference.

Despite the LGLA's many victories, Wallace says that much more needs to be done. Even in San Francisco in 1995 many lesbians and gays are reluctant to come out at work. As Wallace explained: "Many people say, 'I am out at work, but I don't talk about it.' Well, they are not really 'out'. And if it's like that here imagine what it's like in other cities", he added.




