




# ALTERNATIVE BOOKSHOPS

## Why we all need alternative bookshops.

What's alternative about an alternative bookshop?

Well, in the first place, most of the titles listed in the *New Anarchist Review* are not available on the shelves of any other sort of bookshop, which is part of the reason why the radical bookselling movement evolved in the first place.

In the 1970s, a resurgence in radical publishing in the UK meant facing the inevitable problem of distribution.

Then, as now, the UK's bookselling industry was practically a duopoly - dominated by WH Smith in the South and Menzies in the North. To this day, very few alternative books have made it to the shelves of either.

So alternative bookshops began to spring up all over the place. Often staffed by volunteers, sometimes in squatted buildings, always short of cash. But they re-introduced enthusiasm to

bookselling. They offered an alternative to the usual diet of bestsellers and coffee table hardbacks. In some cases they were the only, or main bookshop in their area.

The 80s haven't been easy years for the alternatives, but they are still a force to be reckoned with. If you're new to anarchist ideas, they can be a good starting point. A place to browse, and a place to make contacts. We'd be glad to recommend all the shops listed here.







rhetoric. The arguments  
raised in the *Open Letter*  
were later to contribute to  
the emergence of council-  
ism - a form of libertarian  
communism based on  
workers' councils.






