



ROCK AGAINST RACISM



ondon, Saturday 28th June 1980. Gay Pride March. The real confrontation started with Frank's arrest. He was wearing a hat with an old rusty meat cleaver decorating it. They called it an offensive weapon. He was arrested. Julian saw the arrest and ran down the march asking people to stop as a protest. He was only able to reach the back half which halted in Parliament Square. Other people went to the front of the march to tell them of the arrests, but stewards told the marchers there had been no arrests and encouraged them to continue, which they did. Back in Parliament Square some marchers sat down in the street in protest and were dragged onto the pavement by the police. Stewards persuaded about half of the people who had stopped to continue the march. Those who were left regrouped around a statue. They were attacked front and rear by the police who kicked and punched them and pushed them down the steps of the statue. People linked arms and chanted, with irony, "This is a free country" and "The British police are wonderful" during the police attack. In this scuffle Don, Jack and Julian were arrested. The end of the march reformed with everyone battered but defiant and continued up Whitehall to Malet Street, where the march was planned to end.


Outside the Students' Union in Malet Street large numbers of people stood around, incertain of what to do next, while they were told of the arrests. People demanded a march to Bow Street Police Station where those arrested had been taken. On hearing this the police sealed off both ends of the street. Increasing numbers of people tried to breach the police lines, at first peacefully, and then more angrily. A large number of people broke through the lines, but were surrounded and thrown savagely back into the street. 4 more people were arrested and the police lines strengthened, in some places 5 deep. All the marchers turned to face the police and an electrifying cry of 'Stonewall, Stonewall, Stonewall' was taken up by the whole crowd, filling the air

Unable to contain the situation the police were forced to let the march continue to Bow Street. 2000 people left Malet Street shouting and singing. In Kingsway the police halted the march and there were scuffles and a sit down protest as the police tried to split off the front group. Two people were picked out at random and arrested and there was intense harassment of many marchers, and threats of more arrests.

Eventually the march moved on and was finally halted one block from the police station. Mounted police, police vans, and coaches of police reinforcements surrounded the police station and flooded the adjoining streets. A delegation from the march, including a lawyer, went into the police station and secured the release on bail of all 10 people arrested. Charges included obstruction, carrying an offensive weapon and assault on a police officer.

In the street outside the marchers waited for over an hour until all had been released. There were impromptu street theatre performances and much singing and shouting. There was much rejoicing in the street when all 10 were reunited with the marchers. The release was celebrated briefly and an exhausted crowd returned to Malet Street. Upon his release Frank said — "The police asked me if I had been injured and whether I needed a doctor. I told them I was OK but I sure could do with a hairdresser." The trial date for all 10 has been set for 23rd July.
