Nottingham CND Newsletter April/May 2010

First I must apologise for not getting a newsletter out sooner, but what with my computer being down and the really bad weather, we, as a local group, have not been very active over the last few months. This however, is going to change, hopefully with your help, as we are entering a period when CND needs to be seen to be active as a lot of major decisions regarding Trident Nuclear Weapons Replacement are going to be made. As I expect, you are aware the General Election is very likely to be called for at the beginning of May. To this end National CND is calling on all members to raise the issue of the renewal of Trident which is likely to exceed £76 billion pounds. It is important that we raise this as often as possible with our prospective candidates to find out how they stand on this issue.

If you have a computer you can contact them on line in the following way You can do this by going onto the National CND website:

- 1) Google CND UK
- 2) Click on to No to Trident
- 3) Go to 'Get Involved' and click on 'Events'
- 4) Under 'Take Action' on the left hand side click on 'Lobby Your Candidates'
- 5) In the box put in your post code and click on 'find your candidates'
- 6) Put ticks against those candidates you wish to send a lobbying email
- 7) Enter your personal details and put your name in the box at the bottom
- 8) Tick the box if you are happy for National CND to contact you and click on 'submit'

If you receive any replies follow instructions 1 – 4 and insert your postcode under 'send us feedback' and follow the instructions. It will be very interesting to see what response we receive. Otherwise write to the candidates or raise the issue at hustings.

The outcome of the election could significantly affect the Non Proliferation Treaty Conference which is taking place in May. It would be a fantastic outcome if the UK government would go along saying they are not going to replace Trident as it would advance plans considerably for the possibility of global nuclear disarmament. This conference is also very significant as regards the Initial Gate decision as they need approval from the Conference before further developments on the design of the new submarines are undertaken.

Nottingham CND Activities

On April 17th we are holding our first stall in the Market Square in Nottingham. We are hoping that we can get enough people there to draw attention to the cost of Trident renewal and compare this to the massive cuts that are planned in the public sector which will see many people made redundant and the services to the public, especially the vulnerable people, being greatly reduced. If you have any ideas on how we can attract as much attention as possible on the day, please let me know. It would be really good if we could involve other organisations like trade unions, Stop the War, climate change groups etc so do please come up with ideas.

May Day - Saturday 1st May - Midday onwards

This year May Day will be celebrated in Nottingham in the Victoria Park, Bath Street, near Sneinton Market. There is going to be a March through the city centre plus a rally with music and speeches. Nottingham CND, together with other organisations, will be having a stall. It should be a good day out, so do please try and come down and help on the stall - especially as it is likely to be near the general election and this is an opportunity to promote No Trident Replacement.

Green Festival Sunday 23rd May - 11am to 5pm

The Green Festival this year is being held in the Arboretum, Nottingham. After last year's brilliant weather, where we managed to have a really successful tombola, I now have no items left for this year so if you want a tombola it is really important that I have items for it. So please have a look
