VIETNAM DEMONSTRATION FLOPS

Last Saturday and Sunday at the Pier Head underlined once again the fact that the Merseyside Anarchist Group lacks the infrastructure needed to translate ideas into practice.

Totally inadequate arrangements were made for the preparation and distribution of the special issue of <u>Insert</u>, with the final touch being provided when it was left at a flat where it could not be collected on Saturday morning. (On Sunday no-one bothered to collect it, so the whole demonstration took place without the one piece of literature which tried to present the pacifist-anarchist case as seen by those taking part.)

The planned teach-in at St Mary's Church Hall did not even take place and no further comment will be made here, though the whole matter will merit a careful post-mortem.

Most members of the Group who had indicated their support for the demo (though, to be fair, very few were enthusiastic about it) failed to turn up. Saturday produced three demonstrators, and Sunday the same number (but not the same people).

As anarchists we do not seek to blame individual members of the Group for "failing to pull their weight" or some similar phrase. Rather we look for the reasons in the nature of the situation. It is obvious that the project did not arouse the degree of enthusiasm needed for its success and this indicates that in future we must examine all suggestions for like projects with a critical eye and not commit ourselves unless we are fairly certain of success.

SOCIALISM

The march towards Animal Farm progresses every day in Britain, with its own insidious brand of socialism. Communism differs from socialism by its degree, not by its nature. The ultimate aim is the same with all its variations - 1984.
