
preferred times when you write.

It also investigates the confrontations between students and visiting Tory speakers during 1985-86, showing how the government was able to benefit from them, by using

them as an excuse to curtail the use of campuses for public meetings.

The book exposes some unpleasant facts about the extreme right-wing Federation of Conservative Students, focusing particularly on its relationships with some of the Americanfunded, right-wing groups operating here.

The book puts the government's education policies into political context, showing how the education system can be expected to develop if things continue the way they are going now.



same time the condition of the labour movement in each of the countries involved. It considers the background to the break up of the International Miners' Federation in 1983.

It also asks some searching questions about the actions of the communist authorities of the Eastern bloc — particularly the Polish government, which helped defeat the strike by supplying coal to British power stations throughout the dispute.

As part of the Freedom Centenary, the latest volume of selected writings is World War — Cold War. A collection of fascinating articles, comments and bitter criticism, written during and immediately after the Second World War. It may be fashionable now to debunk the cosy images of WW2 as a 'we're-all-in-thistogether' adventure, but it wasn't then.

There's considerable irony in the fact that War Commentary, which landed itself in trouble with the authorities more than once, was publishing then the sort of 'seditious' comment that passes as history today. (See also the three supplementary volumes detailed below.)

THE LEFT AND WORLD WAR TWO 1939-1945

Where was the rest of the Left while the anarchists

were opposing the war? As these articles show, busy destroying its threadbare credibility. Here the Communist Party is exposed for its slavish devotion to Stalin. The trade unions are shown supporting naked British imperialism - all pretence at internationalism gone, all pretence at protecting workers' interests shelved for the war effort. Only the anarchists pointed out the obvious - that only revolution could really rid Europe of fascism.

From 1945-1950 the Labour government set about nationalising the very industries and services which the government is today busy selling. Here are some damning criticisms of the NHS idea - criticisms which

today seem lost under the weight of the cuts versus no-cuts debate.



I must admit that my heart sank when I discovered that Matt had sent me a collection of anarchist cartoons to review. I thought I'd find them unfunny, obscure and pedantic. In fact, all that reveals is my own prejudice.

I found them humourous to the point of laughing out loud on occasions (a rare occurence with political cartoons, where a wry smile is usually the best I can manage), easily comprehensible to anyone who takes an interest in the way of the world, and with a delightful way of spearing the bubble of ultra-left in-speak. To be able to laugh while still making a point and without making it cruel, is a gift.

Wildcat has a go at all aspects of the establishment — church, government, law enforcement, international affairs — and suffers all sorts of ignominious reprisals from persons in authority, but always comes back for more.

Donald Rooum points out that strip cartoons are full of cats (and he lists 38) but Wildcat is just that little bit different from any feline you've met before. For a start, Wildcat is a SHE...

I don't usually read reviews myself. I don't want to know what other people think of a book, I like to make up my own mind. So I suggest you totally ignore what I've said above and go and read it for yourself.



The Catechism of the Revolutionist has justly been described as one of the most disgusting documents ever written. For those whose bedtime reading (and fantasies) consist of Machiavelli's The Prince and Lenin's What is to be Done?, it will no doubt prove essential.

Reading like a character



expelled from the pages of Turgenev's Fathers and Sons for being too extreme, Nechayev, who obviously perceives any relationship between means and ends as some liberal aberration, gleefully advocates blackmail, coercion, exploitation, in fact "any means necessary" in actualising "the task of terrible, total, universal, merciless destruction".

The Catechism was not originally intended for publication, and is split into sections including The Attitude of the Revolutionary Towards Himself, and The Attitude of the Revolutionary Towards Society.

Bakunin described this document as a "catechism of brigands" and it obviously has nothing to do with

anarchism. Perhaps it is best to approach it as a manifestation of the closed world of fanaticism, with Nechayev as the austere high priest unleashing universal destruction and coldly proclaiming the commandments of nihilism: "everything is moral which assists the triumph of revolution. Immoral and criminal is everything which stands in its way".

This pamphlet is required reading for cadres everywhere.

WHAT IS COMMUNIST ANARCHISM? Alexander Berkman Phoenix Press £3.00 (A)


What is Communist Anarchism? is the key text of the anarchist movement founded in the 19th century by Michael Bakunin. It was published in 1928 when its author, Alexander Berkman, was in his 50s and had experienced both a 14-year prison sentence in the US and a two-year stay in Russia (1920/21), where he had seen the Communist destruction of the social revolution to which he had devoted his life. Despite all this his optimism was undiminished. "I consider anarchism the most rational and practical conception of a

social life in freedom and harmony, I am convinced that its realisation is a certainty in the course of human development."



Berkman was way off mark in his optimism about the nearness of the anarchist millenium. It is 60 years since he wrote, and we are no nearer a free society now than we were then. Nevertheless, much of what is said still holds good. He illustrates the class nature of the justice system using the cases of the Haymarket Martyrs, Mooney and Billings, Sacco and Vanzetti. He documents the reactionary nature of organised religion. He dismisses reforms because they treat the symptom but not the cause of social wrong. He

shows parliamentary democracy to be a fraud masking capitalist rule. Socialism to have become corrupted by power. He analyses the disaster of the Bolshevik victory in Russia.

Publishers note: this edition of 'What is Communist Anarchism?' is approximately three-fifths of the original text. The rest of the book is already available as THE ABC OF ANARCHISM published by Freedom Press.






1926 (including Makhno, Arshinov and Ida Mett), this pamphlet was a restatement of anarchism, by those who had experienced Bolshevism first hand.

On first publication the Platform came under attack from some of the anarchist movement's best known names - Malatesta and Berkman among them. Its programme of libertarian communism was accused of being one step away from Bolshevism. Yet the platformists were to have some influence across Europe, and the questions of organisation it addressed would continue to resurface until the present time.

Phoenix Press is asking for loans to get back into print the old Solidarity title Hungary '56 by Andy Anderson, which is about the uprising in Hungary in that year that was eventually put down by the invading Russian Army. Many readers of the NAR will have read Hungary '56 and will therefore be aware of its importance as a key document of the revolutionary movement. (Those of you who don't know much about what happened in '56 are advised to read the autumn '87 issue of the Solidarity journal which is mostly given over to a long article on the events of that year.) In addition to their importance to the peoples of Eastern Europe, the 1956 events in Hungary marked the beginning of the breakdown of the Stalinist monolith in Western Europe, the Communist Party stranglehold on the revolutionary movement. (One consequence of '56 was the emergence, several years later, of the Solidarity group.) The events of the late '60s can in part be attributed to the collapse of the Western Communist Parties after '56 and, in the opinion of one Solidarity member, can only be understood in the light of '56. Hungary '56 has been out of print in Britain for

years and it is high time that it (along with other Solidarity titles) was made available again.

The idea is this. Lend money to Phoenix Press in multiples of £20 and when enough money has been raised (getting on for £1,000) the book will be printed. For every £20 you lend you get a copy of the book. When the print run sells out you will be offered the return of your money. (But this is likely to take several years and you will in any case be asked to continue the loan for another book.) Phoenix Press has already published three books using this subscription scheme so you needn't worry that the book won't appear or that you won't be offered your money back (eventually). If you can afford to lend £100 please do so. Don't forget that money sitting in a bank or building society account helps prop up capitalism. 


