'Failure': Father 'X'


broken his chastity vows.

#### 'THE LITTLE PET SHOP OF HORRORS'


Peter Hemingway, manager of Living World Pet Shop on Armley Road, Leeds, is this issue's biggest bastard boss.

Way back in November 1992, Pete was found guilty of sacking a woman worker for the 'crime' of getting pregnant.

The tribunal Kathleen Downey had taken him to awarded her £1,500 compensation, to be paid in 28 days unless he wanted to appeal against their decision. No appeal was forthcoming, but then neither was the cash.

Seven months later, Pete was again ordered to pay up within 28 days, after Ms Downey had paid £50 for a bailiff's order to seize goods against the amount of the award. Still nothing!

Hemingway, who drives a Ferrari, and is away on holiday in the Philippines (probably costing a lot more than £1,500), seems



unperturbed. After all, bailiffs might act fast when it's poor people who can't pay their bills, but wealthy businessmen are in another league. In fact, unlike the woman he sacked, he can afford to ignore them altogether.

Even if he is eventually forced to pay (only after Ms Downey has had to pay yet more money to make him), the longer he waits the less the £1,500 will be worth. By now it's 16 months since he was first ordered to pay, so Hemingway has made over £200 in interest on the £1,500, which is now worth only a little over £1,400 com-

pared to its value in 1992.

All bosses are bastards. They all make us work for less than we are worth, but that doesn't make it right. They all hire or fire us when it suits them, but because it happens everywhere is no reason to assume it's natural. None of them really care about our health and safety, but that doesn't make it 'not worth making a fuss about'. It's always worth having a go back at them, either one at a time, like this little article, or all together - say, putting them up against a big wall and letting them have it.

As far as Peter Hemingway is concerned, he treats his workers like the dog shit they have to clean up. He should be made to eat the stuff!

It's easy to get pissed off and feel helpless when we're kicked from pillar to post, constantly bombarded with bad news and then told that we're to blame for everything that's going wrong...

But every day, in hundreds of different ways, people are having a go back at this shitty system. From refusing to pay our council taxes, to fighting for better wages at work, from trying to stop nursery closures to taking action against anti-social criminals – in loads of ways, big and small, we're screwing up their plans for a mass of obedient workers and consumers.

A different example of people fighting back happened in Leeds recently with a protest against 'Children in Need'. About 60 disabled people, and some non-disabled supporters, stormed the West Yorkshire Playhouse. Chanting "Piss on Pity!" and "Rights not Charity!", they blocked the

entrance to the theatre where the BBC were trying to broadcast.

One of the people involved explained why they were opposed to charity: "it makes out that disabled people are the

problem because there is something wrong with us. Charity's answer is to provide services to look after us, or research to find a cure for us.

"Neither of these is what disabled people want. We want to be in control of our own lives."

Moments like this are brilliant, when we give two fingers to the way they want us to live and

start to do what we want.

#### BOSSES - BAD FOR YOUR HEALTH!

The government-appointed heads of the new United Leeds Teaching Hospitals NHS Trust have come up with a new wheeze for raking in the cash at the expense of health care.

They have aimed their sights at student nurses, who are currently housed in student quarters on hospital sites at Chapel Allerton, LGI and Jimmy's. They have sent out mass eviction notices to all nursing and medical students at these sites saying they are turning them out on the street by the end of April.

The old Chapel Allerton site is to be closed completely – the rumour is that the trust has been trying to flog the site to the West Yorks cops – although the Trust management deny that they have finalised a deal with the filth, they have admitted to negotiations with them.

The Trust doesn't give a damn for the welfare or safety of the student nurses, the majority of whom are women and will now have to cope with getting home to private rented housing at all hours of the night and morning, as well as having the extra hassle of having to deal with the crap housing and dodgy landlords in the private student housing sector.

To add insult to injury, those who remain in Trust housing have been sent (in the same envelope as their eviction notices!) notice that rents are to rise massively from a weekly rate of £18 for a single room with shared facilities, up to £40; and family flats from £38 to £80.

Stuart Ingham, the boss of the Trust, takes home £83,000 a year and doesn't live in a student flat.

The logic is sound – the more people to die early, the less to share in the pension fund profits. Unfortunately, not all the pension fund members see it this way.




