


A STORM of protest been whipped up Western Europe by Prestdent Reagan's comments on limiting nuclear war to Europe.

He was asked in an interview in Washington last day if he thought could be hostilities in Europe "without having buttons pressed all the way up the line."

He replied: "I could see where you could have the exchange of tactical weapons against troops in the field without bringing in either one of the major powers to pushing the button."



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

Sid Vicious is dead, Jimmy Pursey's retired to his country mansion but punk lives on. In Bristol a whole welter of new young bands are still thrashing out that special mixture of anarchy and musical mayhem; ageing hippy DAVE HIGGITT visited the recent punk festival at Trinity Hall and lived to tell the tale.

A BRISTOL "Punk Festival"? Well, that's what the posters promised. At least five local bands on the bill plus anyone else who turned up suitably attired with a couple of guitars and a pair of drum sticks....

On the night no less than twelve bands turned up, and even more remarkable, they all managed to play - all bar one that is, but that's another story. Trinity Hall, a run down and partly rennovated church in Old Market, provided a suitably bizarre and sombre setting for this orgy of lunatic guitar thrashing, screaming anarchistic vocals and manic pogoing.

Seems like we've got a revival on our hands, and Bristol, home territory of superspikes The

Vicesquad, is at the forefront Talk about a revival to the punks themselves, however, and they don't like it. John Finch, lead guitar with Lunatic Fringe. "There's no revival. It's just a continuation." It's become slightly more hip in the press maybe, and it's got slightly more publicity... We've been going fallonger than this so-called revival we haven't changed. We're just carrying on what we've always wanted to do!"

Down at Trinity it seems that not a lot has changed. Solvents may have replaced speed as the number one mind-blower, but all the other ingredients of 1976 are there. The kids up front and on the stage are mostly still at school or on the dole. The bands - Lunatic Fringe and Court Martial - to have a chat about the Bristol scene. In the event all the members of both bands turned up, along with a couple of equally vocal punk friends. John's comment on the

couple of equally vocal punk friends. John's comment on the movement's misrepresentation in the media was one of many which inspired a mixture of applause, laughter and the odd jeer from the assorted punks and punkettes crammed into the OW office.

The local punks possess a camarade and a sense of group identity which was perfectly summed up in the organisation of the festival. There was outside security, no stay managers; just about fift, people milling around by the side of the stage and arguing about who should play next. True anarchistic democracy, and yet it worked a treat. The switch round between bands was the quickest I have ever seen, bar none.

And what about the music? Under the circumstances most of the bands put on reasonable performances. The P.A. was tinny and barely adequate and the majority of the groups were restricted to playing two or three songs. Any potential visual fects were lost by the omplète lack of stage lighting wasn't subdued.

The air of subdued violence which hangs in the air at any event such as this was thankfully never expressed in physical terms. Rumours abounded that certain right wing elements were coming down to Old Market to sort out all these degenerate anarchists. It remained merely a rumour, but, coincidentally

enough, Trinity was firebombed and badly damaged only three nights after the last punk made his weary way home from the festival.

So why does punk still maintain an unsavoury reputation for attracting violence? John of Lunatic Fringe again: "In any cult you've got a few nutters but basically punk is a peaceful movement. Punk is about different things. Say with mods or skins, violence is a vital part of

he cult. With punk you'll get the occasional person who does go looking for trouble, but they're misguided. I think the press are to blame for giving us a bad name - they hate our movement cos it encourages people to think for themselves."

The quotes in this article are gleaned from a choatic "interview" staged a couple of days after the Trinity grant invited spokesmen from two

Technically, most of the bands clearly slotted into the "enthusiastic-but-amateurish" bracket rather than the "I-usedto-be-a-session-musician category; hardly surprising of course and very much in keeping with the pick-up-aguitar-and-have-a-go spirit of the original punks. In the cynical

80's the noises and vocals. bashed out sounded on occasions naive to the point of embarrassment. Creating a cacophony and doing cover versions of old Damned songs hardly constitutes an important musical development. More than a couple of the bands were clearly lacking even the merest hint of talent - can't name any names because most of the groups arrived on stage unannounced or inaudibly announced.

The reaction from the crowd to the music was interesting. It ranged from complete indifference to the wildest pogoing. There was no middle ground, no polite clapping, though this does not - in punk language constitute disapproval.

"Bear" from Lunatic Fringe: "Everybody said it was a great night afterwards. You don't need to clap - that's all part of the old rock star syndrome; 'encore, encore' and all that shit. If they dance they like us."

Lunatic Fringe played by far the longest set of the evening and showed enough promise to suggest than they could have a realistic crack at the national market. Their songs were tighter and more memorable than most of the bands and they induced the most "positive" reaction from the audience (you know the sort of thing - people hurling themselves from the stage into the seething throngs below etc etc)

Spyrex Doom showed that punk has retained a sense of humour, and kept the crowd (well me at least) amused with their punked-up version "Jingle Bells". Court Martial were one of the youngest and most

interesting bands on offer but suffered more than most from having their set truncated by the crowded running schedule. Having warmed up with a couple of strong numbers they were unceremoniously ushered off to allow another group to have a crack at instant fame.

The most bizarre events of the evening were saved for the end. Two bands were left: Clevedon hopefuls. The Review, and Bristol heroes Disorder. After considerable delay and much bad feeling, The Review, appeared, and their excellent set (including a strong version of their latest single, "Englands Glory") coincided with a mass exodus from the punters and other bands (including the ultradisgruntled Disorder crowd) it seems that The Review's insistence on using some of their own equipment and on generally "behaving like rock stars" had blown their credibility as far as the spiked-ones of Bristol were concerned.

"They'll never fuckin' play with any Bristol band again," muttered Bear ominously during the OW interview. If The Review ever make it (and they've certainly got the talent) it will be despite rather than because of their local contacts.

It's easy to be cynical about the revitalization of the punk movement, but the new generation of punks are as committed and genuine as the original founders of the cult. Being a punk is not easy; in fact it can be very dangerous as the members of Lunatic Fringe unanimously assured me: "Yeah, we've all been beaten up because of our appearance that's been the inspiration for some of our songs. There are certain no-go areas, areas which you have to avoid or be sensible... I wouldn't walk up Park Street at night anyway."

On the subject of racism, one member of Court Martial (who wishes to remain anonymous in case his mother reads this article!) did not mince his words:

"Yeah, I'm anti-racist, but I'm not really bothered. You get black cunts and you get white cunts."

And what about being on the dole? Bear: "I don't believe in work." Nick: "The only reason I'd get a job is to get some money for the band." John: "I'm perfectly capable and willing to work, but because of my appearance I'm not allowed to." (All bar one of Court Martial are still at school).

So what's the future for the young punk hopefuls of the West Country? Will Vicesquad's success act as a boost to the local scene? The general feeling was an emphatic No: ".... They've got national press now, but their not helping out Bristol. They're not a fair representative of the local movement; they're all high in the clouds now, they've got no control over what they're

doing."

The punks also give an unanimous thumbs down for the local "independent" set-up, condemning Circus, Revolver and Recorder in turn. Bear: "Look, we've got the fealthiest punk scene in England but we get ignored by all the trendy local independents... There's more to Bristol than those trendy Clifton twats. I mean look at the Recorder - they reckon they're the biggest thing coming out of Bristol and they've produced three of the worst albums I've ever heard."

The punks of '77 who later deserted the movement are held in contempt by their '81 counterparts. Bear: "They're just nothing, just posers... They got into the mods or the skins or blitz... or they became normal

again."

So where will today's punks be in four years time? The last word goes to Nick: "Dunno really. We'll be related to punk. We're not gonna be anything else, put it like that... we'll all be dirty and scruffy... we're not gonna flatten out hair down. We ain't gonna become punk hippies. In any case we'll probably all be dead."
